Hey Janet,

Thanks for your patience as I reviewed the material you sent.

SNAPS has reviewed the request by the jurisdiction representatives in the OR-505 Oregon Balance of State Continuum of Care (CoC) to split the existing CoC into 2 CoCs comprising Marion and Polk Counties and the remaining members of the Oregon Balance of State respectively. SNAPS acknowledges the following documentation from the parties involved:

1. Documentation that the stakeholders of the new CoC voted to form a new CoC
2. Documentation that the new CoC (Marion/Polk Counties) notified the existing CoC (Oregon Balance of State) of its intent to form a new CoC
3. Submission of a governance charter for the new CoC in compliance with the CoC Program Interim Rule
4. Evidence of efforts to implement a coordinated entry system
5. Evidence of an operational Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) that is consistent with HUD's most recent HMIS data standards and able to create all necessary reports
6. Documentation that the new CoC has selected a Collaborative Applicant

The jurisdictions provided sufficient evidence to support the split of the existing OR-505 Oregon Balance of State CoC into the following 2 CoCs:

OR-504 Salem/Marion, Polk Counties CoC

OR-505 Oregon Balance of State CoC

Both CoCs will continue to work with HUD's Portland field office.

Split CoCs need to be prepared to report their 2020 HIC and PIT data into separate CoCs in the HUD Homelessness Data Exchange (HDX). HUD recommends that the respective CoCs download the Housing Inventory Count, Point-in-Time (PIT) count, and system performance data reported under the current OR-505 Oregon Balance of State CoC. This data may be needed for reporting in HUD's CoC Program Competition and for other local data uses. With regard to your system performance measures data, HUD recommends that you take the option of resubmitting last year's data for each CoC. If that is not possible, the CoC will need to submit the data associated with the current CoC for comparisons to past data until the CoC has enough data on their own to rely on those comparisons within the CoC. For help on

specific actions with regard to data in HDX we can connect you to staff at Abt Associates that can assist you if you need instructions on how to export previous year's data and answer other HDX-related questions.

SNAPS will work to associate the projects identified below with the correct CoC the new CoC for the purpose of the 2020 CoC Program Competition. SNAPS will also work with PCL to assign the existing Annual Performance Reports (APRs) in Sage to the appropriate CoCs. Per the negotiation discussed on page 126 of the PDF you sent, 3 grants will need to be amended. Please work with your field office and the organizations that will be involved in the amendments to accurately execute this.

Please see attached a document that shows the current list of projects (applied for in the 2019 CoC Program Competition) and the proposed distribution to the respective CoCs. The first tab shows the current list and the next 2 tabs show the distribution to the respective CoCs. The final list is subject to any decisions that get made based on the 2019 CoC Program Competition selection process. We should revisit after the 2019 awards are announced.
