


CoC Collaborative Committee Survey Summary 10/21/20

3. What has been the best thing about Collaborative Committee meetings? (n=25)

Grouped by common themes:

Getting the full picture of our community response to homelessness
Holistic view of progress and/or challenges
Gaining perspective about totality of homeless services
Understand the “lay of the land”
Up to date on what is happening in our community
How to provide coordinated services as effectively as possible
Learning about how things are advancing

Each agency knows what the others are doing
Learning about resources in the community
Learning about the difference resources and services
Hearing about other services that could collaborate with our programs
Hearing from other agencies about what they are doing to end homelessness
Better understand what’s available and where to direct our guests to find the right services

Important to work together and I can see that is happening

4. What would improve Collaborative Committee meetings? (n=20)

Grouped by common themes:

More interactive/engaging

I don't know how I am supposed to participate

Seem very one-sided, lots of information being pushed out with little time for interaction, follow-up

A "review" of the main points and work from previous mtg. at the beginning and "next steps" at the end

Find ways to streamline housekeeping chores

Get committee updates in writing before the meeting so more questions could be asked

Come prepared and informed to collaborate

Making sure we stay on task

We do an okay job adhering to the agenda for the most part. I'd like to see some more of the extraneous conversations encouraged to be continued at another time.

Is there a precise goal for the gathering? Not sure.

Having one agency per meeting sharing what they do in their programs

Maybe each mtg. should include a period of "good news" stories to highlight related to the purpose

Having a focus

Focus on specifics of building a CoC, using the HUD blueprint – e.g., community-wide understanding of and participation in HMIS and coordinated entry, identifying and correcting the social service system failures that have resulted in our large chronically homeless population

Every community partner working toward the best interest of our clients and not the best interest of their individual program

I'd love it if there was a one page summary about the history, background, and what we were doing/how things were done vs what the CoC is doing – sort of how we got here

Recorded video/audio for those unable to attend live...in addition to reading meeting minutes

Zoom is difficult to get people to talk

As good as can be expected for a large Zoom meeting

Barring the ability to meet in person I am not sure
