This CoC Planning Grant for this Special NOFO will support the Mid-Willamette Valley Homeless Alliance, a Continuum of Care serving the Marion-Polk region of Oregon, by: (1) supporting staff coordination work to implement the Comprehensive Plan for Serving Individuals and Families Experiencing Homelessness with Severe Service Needs; and (2) supporting data analysis and strategic improvements in System Performance Measures related to housing people with severe service needs experiencing unsheltered homelessness.

The Comprehensive Plan lays out some ambitious goals for the CoC to achieve, such as training street outreach workers, expanding low barrier shelter and permanent housing, leveraging healthcare resources through partnerships with medical providers, and meaningfully engaging people with lived experience in decision making processes. These strategies will require coordination that organizes opportunities for partnerships and conducts outreach and support for volunteers engaged in the process. This planning grant will purchase needed staff coordination hours that will support implementing the objectives and strategies articulated in the plan.

A key responsibility of the staff coordination role will be to support the provider awarded funds through this Special NOFO with project launch, making sure that the project is moving forward within established timelines, hiring qualified workers, applying best practices such as Housing First, and setting up data collection procedures that will generate quality data that will be used to track project performance. Staff coordination hours will support this effort as well.

Staff hours will also be needed to collect and analyze data generated from the project and from the CoC region generally, with the expectation of taking the pilot project to scale within the three-year grant period.

These planning grant funds will help the CoC ensure that it is carrying out the requirements of Subpart B of 24 CFR Part 578 which requires Continuums of Care to establish performance targets appropriate for population and program type, monitor recipient and subrecipient performance, and evaluate outcomes. These funds will also help the CoC carry out the requirement to coordinate the implementation of a housing and service system within the Marion-Polk geographic area that meets the needs of the homeless individuals

Funding from this project application will be used to coordinate the implementation of a housing and service system to prevent and end homelessness within the CoC's geographic area by using essential staff support hours to leverage housing and healthcare partnerships, ensure timely project launch and implementation, and providing the CoC with quality data and data analysis to evaluate how proposed strategies are achieving the desired outcomes for this subpopulation with complex needs and lengthy histories of unsheltered homelessness.

**2. Describe the estimated schedule for the proposed activities, the management plan, and the method for assuring effective and timely completion of all work.**



- The estimated schedule for implementing the proposed activities is:
1. May 1, 2023 – April 30, 2024 – **PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION:** Support the project provider in completing HUD contract requirements; launching project implementation through recruiting, hiring, and training staff; selecting project participants through Coordinated Entry; establishing target performance outcomes and setting up data collection systems (measurements, frequency of reporting).
  2. June 1, 2023 – May 31, 2024 – **TRAINING:** Establish and implement a training plan for street outreach workers especially designed to adapt street outreach practices to immediately house people with severe service needs in low barrier shelter and permanent housing; conduct best practices training with healthcare and homeless service providers on service delivery protocols from referrals of subpopulation with severe service needs.
  3. July 1-December 31, 2024 – **EVALUATION:** Conduct first annual performance assessment; analyze System Performance Measure and other quantitative and qualitative data. Host debrief sessions with project provider where protocols and practices are reviewed and adjusted, as needed.
  4. May 1, 2024-June 30, 2025 – **IMPLEMENT PROJECT LEARNINGS:** Using quantitative and qualitative data, monitor and assess project implementation, including adjusted protocols; continue adapting and implementing training plans; work towards completion of policy development and healthcare partnership designs and agreements.
  5. May 1, 2025-April 30, 2026 – **GEAR UP FOR TAKING THE PROJECT TO SCALE:** Integrate data reports, project implementation learning, policies, and partnerships into regionwide meetings and trainings with expanded partner cohorts (homeless service providers, healthcare providers, housing providers, businesses, law enforcement, etc.). Prepare to take the project to scale with anticipated launch date of June 1, 2026.

CoC staff bring strong project management skills to ensure the timely start of the project elements, developing work plans with interim timeline targets, and completing tasks within established deadlines. CoC staff report directly to the CoC Board of Directors.

The proposed activities will be completed by establishing and implementing the work plan. CoC staff will meet at least bi-weekly to ensure projects are on track and report activities and results to the board monthly.

**3. How will the requested funds improve or maintain the CoC's ability to evaluate the outcome of CoC and ESG projects?**

The requested Special NOFO Planning Grant funds will provide needed staff capacity to support the CoC's ability to effectively collect and analyze data for both overall system performance and for the performance of the Church at the Park pilot project. Requested planning grant funds will also support staff time to convene and facilitate consultations with Data Team members, Performance & Evaluation Committee members, and to report findings and recommendations at monthly meetings of the CoC Board of Directors.

The CoC has established protocols for evaluating project performance, using local site-based monitoring and assessment tools as the basis for evaluation. Information from APRs, CAPERs, other HMIS reports, and structured interviews form the basis of the CoC's evaluation of this CoC-funded programs.
